

#### 2020 WFN CONTINUATION FUNDING GUIDELINES

This year, we are excited to offer two tracks of Continuation Funding: (1) which continues to support WFN alumni to expand their successful conservation work and the scale up of projects, and (2) nature-based solutions projects that tackle climate change and biodiversity protection hand-in-hand, and in consultation with communities.

WFN **Continuation Funding** grants are offered at two levels:

- (1) **£35,000** over one year or
- (2) up to **£**,70,000 over two years.

Nature-based solutions grants are offered at up to £100,000 over two years.

## Aims of Continuation Funding and Nature-based solutions

- To support the replication, expansion or scale-up of successful work led by winners of the Whitley Award and to foster results sharing; or/and
- To support work that is tackling climate change and biodiversity loss simultaneously. These projects could be working with communities on protecting or restoring habitats that act as a carbon sinks including forests, peatlands, wetlands, mangroves, seagrasses and/or coral reefs, and any other ecosystem-level projects addressing biodiversity loss or preventing further impacts on the climate.
- Applicants need to demonstrate their work is at a timely point where an injection of funds will help propel a well-planned proposal into action.
- Successful proposals will clearly demonstrate cause and effect, and measurable impacts (not just actions) at the end of the proposed workplan.
- Proposals should build on and cite proven successes (including those from previous WFN support) and evidence-based decision making.
- Priority will be given to projects that can demonstrate timely need, whether political, threat-based or financial, and those that can evidence sound monitoring.
- Successful proposals will demonstrate long-term planning for the project and how they will avoid dependence on a single funder and PI.
- Successful proposals for nature-based solutions will be able to indicate measurable ecosystem-level impacts.
- In all assessments, we look for practical projects that can produce measurable and tangible conservation results.
- Collaboration among winners to maximise impacts for wildlife and people at the landscape level is encouraged.
- Applications should refer to the original support given by WFN, evidence clearly how the original grant made an impact and how the new application builds on this work.

#### Eligibility Criteria

- All previous winners of a Whitley Award who have successfully completed their Award grant (Final Report submitted and grant closed by WFN) are eligible.
- Associate Award and Runner up prize winners are not eligible for Continuation Funding.



# **Application Process & Deadlines**

- If you would like to apply, please submit a short (2-page max) concept of the work to be done and outline the budget using the Concept Note form provided. The deadline for the concept note is 15th June.
- Following submission of a concept note, you will either be invited to submit a full application for projects commencing October 2020 or given constructive feedback. Those invited to complete a full proposal will be emailed the application form to complete.
- The deadline by which you need to have submitted a completed application form is 15th August.
- You will be required to provide responses to questions raised by the assessors in the Q&A in September.
- Successful applicants will receive funding in **October**.
- Grants are usually made to a bank account held by a registered NGO. This grant is offered
  as a restricted fund, only for the purposes under which the applicant applied.
- Please note grants will be released in two separate tranches of subject to satisfactory reporting.
- Please note: WFN **does not fund** land purchase, construction projects, rehabilitation of wild animals, or ex-situ breeding of wild animals for release.

### Reporting

- We encourage winners to keep in touch with us regularly by email.
- With a two-year project, we ask winners to provide **formal reports at 12 and 24 months** and **informal updates at 6 and 18 months**, using WFN templates, from the date your grant was received. Acceptance of an annual report releases the next year of funding.
- With a one-year project, we ask winners to provide a formal report at 12 months and an
  informal update at 6 months, using WFN templates, from the date your grant was
  received.
- The financial report needs to show expenditure to date against the original budget.
- Your application and budget should plan for annual reporting to WFN accordingly.
